## 75<sup>th</sup> NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP REGATTA

### AUGUST 11-15, 2014 – MARBLEHEAD, MASSACHUSETTS

## NOTICE OF RACE

The 75th International 110 Class Association National Championship Regatta will take place August 11 through August 15, 2014 at the Eastern Yacht Club in Marblehead, Massachusetts. The Championship Committee of the International 110 Class Association is the organizing authority.

### 1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the “Rules” as defined in the *Racing Rules of Sailing* (RRS). The Bylaws and Rules Committee Rulings of the International 110 Class Association will apply.
- 1.2 The Championship Regulations of the International 110 Class Association will apply.
- 1.3 Advertising is restricted to Appendix 1, Category A.
- 1.4 For protests involving an infringement of Part 2 of the RRS, an arbitration hearing may be held prior to the protest hearing.

### 2. ENTRIES

- 2.1 The regatta is open to skippers who are active members of the International 110 Class Association at the time of registration.
- 2.2 Eligible skippers may enter the regatta by completing the regatta entry form in its entirety and submitting it along with the entry fee to the Championship Committee by Monday, August 11, 2014 at 10:00 a.m. Entries may be made in advance by mailing the entry form and payment to:

- 6.1 The entry fee shall be \$300. Checks should be made out to the “110 Class”. Entries received or postmarked later than Monday, August 1, 2014 will be charged an additional late fee of \$50.
- 6.2 A representative from each boat shall check-in to complete registration and receive sailing instructions.
- 6.3 On-site registration will occur in the bar/porch area of Eastern Yacht Club.

### 2. MEASUREMENTS AND INSPECTIONS

- 6.4 Each yacht entered in the regatta shall have a valid measurement certificate on file with the Class Technical Chairman, Ross Weene.
- 2.1. Safety equipment inspection and boat weighing shall take place at the Eastern Yacht Club Crane area.

## 2.2.

2.2.1. Hull, spar and foil measurements shall be coordinated with Thomas Craig as the designated regatta measurer. An entrant who does not have a measurement certificate or who has modified his/her hull, spar(s) or foil(s) should contact Thomas Craig at [craigt@cpmwolverineproctor.com](mailto:craigt@cpmwolverineproctor.com) prior to August 18, 2011 to make an appointment to ensure measurements can be completed prior to commencement of races.

2.3. Measurement of new or modified sails will take place at Eastern Yacht Club on Monday, August 11 between the 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m.

2.4. A safety equipment inspection may be conducted by the Race Committee at any time during the regatta.

### 4.2.1. Notes:

4.2.1.1. The race committee at its discretion may elect to hold up to a total of 3 races on a single day in order to complete the full number of races scheduled for the regatta.

4.2.1.2. No warning signal will be made after 3:00 p.m. on Friday, 15-Aug.

## **RACING AREA**

5.1. Massachusetts Bay near Tinkers Island off of Marblehead. *Note: Location will be decided by EYC RC.*

## **6. SCORING**

- 6.1. The Low Point scoring will apply.
- 6.2. Three races are required to be completed to constitute a series (not including tune-up).
- 6.3. When fewer than 6 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
- 6.4. When 6 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 6.5. The tune-up race will not be scored.
- 6.6. There must be three Masters' teams to constitute a valid Master's Championship.
  - 6.6.1. In accordance with the deed of gift, any race in with the RC measures wind speeds in excess of 18 knots at any time during that race will not be scored for the Masters' Championship.
- 6.7. There must be two Women teams to constitute a valid Women's Championship.
- 6.8. There must be two Youth teams to constitute a valid Youth Championship.

## **7. LAUNCHING & BERTHING**

- 7.1. Boat will be dry-sailed from the EYC. Single point pickup is preferred but alternatively boats can be lifted by straps connecting to the single crane hook. There is no "rack" for lifting boats with straps.
- 7.2. Boats will be dry-sailed at EYC. All boats should be launched and underway each day by 10:00 am to insure adequate time to sail out to the line for an 11:00 warning gun.

## **8. HOUSING**

- 8.1. Marblehead in August is a busy place, so competitors are encouraged to make housing arrangements early. The Eastern Yacht Club has a limited number of rooms available for rent, and will be offered on a first-come, first-served basis. There are also several hotels and B&Bs in the immediate area, but again reservations should be made promptly.
- 8.2. The possibility exists that the Eastern Yacht Club may be able to provide limited housing through the general membership. Interested parties should contact the Regatta Committee.

## **9. PRIZES**

- 9.1. In addition to the perpetual trophies of the International 110 Class Association, prizes will be awarded to the following:
  - 9.1.1. Top three overall competitor teams.
  - 9.1.2. Top youth team (skipper and crew under 21 years of age).
  - 9.1.3. Top female skipper.
  - 9.1.4. Top master skipper (over 55 years of age).
  - 9.1.5. Daily race winner teams.

## 10. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 10.1. Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.
